-Monetary prizes will be awarded for 1st (\$3.00), 2nd (\$2.00) and 3rd (\$1.00) place for each lot in each division.

-Divisions are as follows: Adults (18 and up) –All categories except table top exhibits

-Primary Youth (age 11 and under) – All categories except canned goods and produce*

-Secondary Youth (age 12 – 17) – All categories except canned goods and produce*

-*There will be a COMBINED Youth division (age 17 and under) for canned goods and produce.

-All non-perishable categories (#1 - #4) will be accepted for entry on Thursday, September 3, 2009 from 3:30 pm until 6:30 pm.

-Categories #5 - #9 will be accepted for entry on Saturday, September 5th until 12 noon.

-All articles and produce must be made or grown by the exhibitor.

- Baked goods will be auctioned off at the Horse show and/or Cattle show on Saturday September 5, 2009.

-All entries must be 8 x 10 or smaller and mounted on card stock, matte, or framed.
